

The toner at Staples is \$90 -\$120 per cartridge for a total around \$400+ for all four cartridges (Canon). The off brand is working fine as we mostly use our printer for newsletters. I will be removing the box in the office and will no longer recycle the ink/toner cartridges.



REMINDER OF THE PET RULES

In Declaration of Condominium Page 20-21, Section 11.18

Domestic pets shall not, at any time, be permitted to become a Public or private nuisance or kept on the premises for breeding

purposes. No domestic pet shall weigh more than twenty-five (25) lbs. or be permitted to run at large and shall be restrained by a leash whenever the pet is outside the home. Owners shall clean up after their pets as specified in local county ordinances and as state laws provides. No pets are allowed in any recreational area at any time. No more that two (2) domestic pets may be maintained in the Unit Owner's home at any time. If a Unit Owner already has two (2) domestic pets residing in their home, they cannot allow or permit a guest to bring their domestic pet into the Unit Owners home or on their property for any duration of time. All guests must adhere to the Governing Document regulations covering domestic pets.

<u>NOTE:</u> We are having issues owners of pets not cleaning up after their pets on other residents' property. Pets are not to be left off leashes to roam the park, this includes cats.







In addition to being a dozen + 3, 15 is the speed limit on all roads in Twin Fountains. Many residents report that a majority of vehicles that exceed the 'park' speed limit are those that belong to park residents. If that includes you, SLOW DOWN! If you want to know what 15 mph is like, drive through any school zone when students are arriving or leaving school & the yellow caution light is flashing or the Sheriff Deputy is present. **THAT** is 15 mph & our 'Park' limit! There are visitors & delivery vehicles that also exceed the limit so please remind **YOUR** family members and **YOUR** visitors to **SLOW DOWN** & drive the speed limit. If you notice a delivery vehicle that is exceeding the limit, get the license number or vehicle number and report it to the company (FEDEX, UPS, USPS, etc.). If it is a 'Park' resident tell them or tell a Board Member – for the latter, provide information as to who, when, where, etc. The 'Park' executive is looking into other options that would be cost-effective as well & may try some on a test basis.

We here at Twin Fountains are blessed to see the most exotic birds. and Florida Sandhill Crane The (Scientific Name: Grus Canadensis) is no exception to what we see here, being such a beautiful and unique creature. On average, they stand up to 4 to 5 feet. They're pretty good-sized birds, usually weighing an average weight of 14 pounds. Their wingspan is longer than the bird is tall. They start their life with an orange tint to their feathers and the color dissipates after



about two months. The Florida Sandhill Crane is a non-migratory bird, which means that this species spends its entire life in Florida. We here in the park can identify these interesting creatures by their red heads and unique trumpet-like call. In June or July every year, residents of Florida like to see the newly born cranes usually staying close to their mother.



These birds have been around since the beginning of time but currently there are about 5,000 Sandhill Cranes still residing in Florida. We've seen these birds here in our park during the daylight hours, but where do they go after dark? The birds migrate to the shallow areas of freshwater lakes every evening. The birds we see in Twin

Fountains probably go to Lake Annie right across the street from us. The shallow water allows the birds to hear danger and prepare for any potential threat that may occur. Wetland drainage and conversion of prairie land for development has threatened the existence of Sandhill Cranes. For this reason, the Florida Sandhill Crane has become a protected species by the U.S. Migratory Bird Treaty Act.



Sandhill Cranes are monogamous, which means when they choose a mate, they stay with that mate their entire life. They live for about 40 to 50 years which is about as long as many married couples stay together. When you see a Sandhill Crane, they won't be alone. They always stay in pairs or in groups for safety. Spring is mating season usually between April and May.

The egg usually takes about 29 to 32 days to hatch. Then the couple that have chosen each other for life will raise their young together. We Florida residents are blessed to be in such a beautiful environment where we see a variety of beautiful, colorful birds and some of them right here at Twin Fountains!
