





June marks the beginning of summer in the Northern Hemisphere and contains the summer solstice, the day with the most daylight hours.



This month we will focus on aesthetics and General Property Restrictions.

THE WORD "PARK" USED IN THIS DOCUMENT REFERS TO THE DAY-TO-DAY OPERATION OF TWIN FOUNTAINS

"Item 19.3 Driveway Size All homes must have a concrete driveway of a length or width to accommodate two (2) full-size cars, and a minimum of 300 square feet of usable space.

All driveways, carports, and storage rooms must be completed within 120 days of the home's arrival on the lot unless given special exemption by the Board of Directors.

Q: What about the asphalt driveways in the park?

A: Those few were grandfathered as they existed before the Declaration was updated but would have to be brought up to the current standard if/when they are replaced.

Q: Can I enclose part of my carport to create more sheltered space?

A: Probably. You must remember that your driveway must be long or wide enough to accommodate 2 (two) full-size vehicles. Depending on how you plan to enclose some of your carport space, you may require a Building Permit. Q: Can I paint my driveway?

A: There is nothing in the 'Park' rules that prohibit the painting of driveways but all aspects or every property must always be aesthetically pleasing.

Item 19.11 Lawn Sprinkler Systems/Rain Sensors All homes with an irrigation system, no matter what the age of the house is, must have an operational rain sensor. The Unit

Owner shall be responsible for maintaining operational sprinkler systems and maintaining sprinkler heads at or below ground level, and at the Owner's discretion, protected by a concrete donut.

Operational sprinkler systems and rain sensors must be installed within 120 days of a home's arrival on a lot.

Q: Water is bubbling up at one of my sprinklers. What do I do?

A: It is likely that the sprinkler head is damaged or the irrigation line at the sprinkler is damaged. It is your responsibility to have that repaired.

Q: One of my sprinkler heads is not working. Who is responsible for it?

A: The owner is responsible and must make repairs as soon as it is noticed. If repairs are not made, the 'Park' will turn your irrigation system off.

Q: When do I water my lawn?

A: You can irrigate on your assigned days – see your house documents for your list of days – and NOT within the hours of 10:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

Q: How long can each zone operate?

A: Each zone is limited to twenty (20) minutes or less operating time.

Item 19.17 Clotheslines Only umbrella type clotheslines shall be permitted in the 'Park'. Should clotheslines become damaged or unsightly, it shall either be removed or replaced immediately.

Q: I have a chance to acquire a T-style set of clothesline posts. Can I put that up instead? A: No. Only umbrella type clotheslines are permitted because other styles are hazardous

to workers.

Q: Can I leave my umbrella clothesline in the 'up' position all the time?

A: No, this is a potential hazard to contractors so please put it 'down' when not in use.

Central Florida Turfgrass Options & Alternatives

When thinking about turfgrass in Central Florida, living here and managing a lawn is a little like that girl Goldilocks and what she thought about porridge. One was too hot, one was too cold, and one was 'just right'! Central Florida enjoys both hot and cold temperatures and that makes the choice of turfgrass a little more challenging. For the most part if you decide on a turfgrass lawn in Twin Fountains, you only have one option that I can think of, which is St. Augustine. I will also comment a little later about the option of other plants and/or mulching. St. Augustine grass is much coarser and spreads mostly by long 'runners'. Here is 'tips' for growing this fine turfgrass.



St. Augustine

St. Augustine requires heavier rates of fertilizer 2.0 – 6.0 lbs./1000 sq. ft. in the spring and a lighter (50%) application in the summer and early fall; it responds best to all fertilizers with a high Potassium (K) percentage; it needs a minimum of 1" of irrigation per week and more in the dry season. It does not go dormant and does not respond well to

being allowed to dry out completely. A St. Augustine lawn that is well-maintained may require a periodic de-thatching. Here is a link with more details about a St. Augustine lawn. Another Option – In reality, turfgrass is nothing more than a ground cover – in that it holds soil in place; keeps soil from drying out and blowing away, and in most cases is easier to maintain than dealing with weeds. But you can consider removing 'grass' plants and replacing some or all of your lawn with Florida native plants and using mulch between the plants to help them develop until they are able to manage on their own. This tends to be a more challenging task early on but once established, you may find it is a lot more rewarding in the longer term. Here is a link to a listing of small to medium native

was dedicated by President Calvin Coolidge. Since then, the Bok Tower Gardens Complex has become one of central Florida's finest tourist attractions.

Or how about hitting the ballpark! The Tampa Bay Rays is a fun-filled experience, especially if



you're a baseball fan, at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg. It is the only Major League Baseball field that is fully enclosed and climate controlled. There is also an amazing "Rays Touch Experience" where one can see and touch live stingrays in the stadium's 10,000-gallon tank.

One of those is NOT spending extra time in the kitchen!
This month I'll share with you an easy, delicious one dish meal that won't take too long to prepare.

Twice Baked Everything Potatoes

Ingredient List:

2 Large baked potatoes
2 Tablespoons butter
1/2 package hidden valley ranch dressing dry mix
1/4 cup sour cream
1/4 cup mayonnaise
1/4 cup whole Milk

Topping:

1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese 1/2 cup green onion, finely chopped 6 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled Everything Bagel Spice Ground Black pepper

Directions:

1. Preheat Oven to 425°

1/2 cup Cheddar Cheese

Salt and black pepper to taste.

- 2. Wash and pierce each of the potatoes
- 3. Place the potatoes on a baking sheet. Rub them with the vegetable oil and bake for 1 hour, making sure they're sufficiently cooked through.
- 4. Cut each potato in half. Scoop out the potato meat from each half and place in a bowl.
- 5. Add: Butter, dry Ranch, sour cream, mayonnaise, whole milk, Cheddar Cheese, and Salt and Pepper. Blend until fully incorporated.
- 6. Spoon 1/4 of the mixture back into each shell.
- 7. Crumble approximately two strips of bacon onto each potato. (Get creative and add chicken, shrimp, or any other protein of your choice!)
- 8. Top with cheddar cheese and green onion.
- 9. Place back into the oven until cheese is melted.

Serve and enjoy!
