





Continuing from last month's newsletter, the following is an overview of the Lake Wales City Council's plans for the CRA Housing Development Project.

The Lake Wales Developer Incentive Program will give developers assistance to build affordable homes in the Core Improvement Area. This means that the actual assistance that is being offered is subject to negotiation and will be made in incremental payments during the construction process or at the project's close. Also, the downpayment by the buyer is available on a case-by-case basis to encourage the home's sale.


The CRA or Community Reinvestment Act of 1977 is meant to encourage insured depository institutions to assist Florida communities with various credit needs including low- and moderate-income neighborhoods. The Lake Wales CRA requires developers to sell homes to qualified homebuyers at or below 120% of the area's median income level.

Downpayment assistance or DPA is a program offered to eligible home buyers that will provide grants, and low-rate loans. Examples of Downpayment Assistance include: \$25,000 cash grant for a downpayment on a home, Cash for mortgage discount points and other closing costs, and mortgage loans at a subsidized interest rate.

A legacy home is a home or cottage that will be passed down to future generations. CBDG is the Community Development Block Grant program that was created by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974.

Lake Wales is partnered with the Housing authority to produce construction ready design drawings specifically for the Grove Manor redevelopment as a walkable, mixed income neighborhood. This includes partnering with a housing contractor who will build infill housing - constructing new homes on vacant or under-used lots that are interspersed among older existing properties that are in established neighborhoods in Lake Wales. Infill housing may also include major refurbishing or reuse of existing homes or commercial buildings) in the Northwest neighborhood which is mostly low-income housing around the Spook Hill and west Lake Wailes area.

Special Attention has been given to Orange Avenue and Lincoln Avenue. Orange Avenue just a little west of N. Lakeshore Blvd. which is on the west side of Lake Wailes. Orange Avenue goes from Johnell Caver Funeral Home all the way to a residential area with what appears to be smaller, Section 8 type homes. Below is a graph showing how the city will be spending the money on housing under their connected plan:



Orange Avenue intersects North First Street, which is very close to the historic Dixie Walesbilt Hotel. All of this information and more is on the Lake Wales Connected Plan website at:

The City is also working with Florida Housing Finance Agency to set up programs to assist first time home buyers. 

3 New Restaurants Planned For Growing US 27 Corridor



Lake Wales continues its growth as businesses are popping up constantly. I noticed an oil change place that seemed to go up overnight next to Aldi's at Thompson Nursery Road and Hwy 27. Now Three more fast-food franchises are coming soon to the ever-growing US 27 corridor in the future, as Starbucks, Freddy's, and Checkers will soon break ground near Eagle Ridge Mall. Actually, Freddy's is almost finished with the other two not too far behind!

Two more independently owned and operated new restaurants are planned for opening on Highway 60: Locorrito and Brake Burger Garage. Two more are planned to open on 1st Street downtown and on Lincoln Avenue. Three more are aiming for construction on US 27 near the Eagle Ridge Mall. All three new restaurants will be located on the east side of US 27 and will occupy

among the last of the rapidly-filling mall outparcels. A Starbucks coffee outlet is planned for a site just south of the Wawa gas station/convenience store. The future Starbucks will share access drives with Wawa and an adjoining office building. No timeline has been set for construction, but city officials have confirmed that the project is in the works. Checkers Drive-in specializes in burgers and fries and is expected to occupy space next door to ABC Wine and Liquors, also facing US 27. It will share access with the south entrance to Eagle Ridge Mall. This writer has observed several Checkers going up in the Atlanta, Georgia area and was impressed with the project management to build these sites out so quickly!

These three new restaurants are expected to draw a significant portion of their business from travelers passing through the area, while providing more than 100 jobs in total, and contributing significant tax revenue locally.
